

# Meaningful discussion on “India without Constitution”

► Bahujan community must unite to protect their rights, says Digvijaya

**Bhopal:** With the objective of protecting social justice, Bahujan consciousness, and democratic values, the “Bahujan Intellect Summit – Chapter 3” was successfully organized today, April 26, 2025, at the Auditorium of Ravindra Bhavan, Bhopal. The central theme of the summit was — “India without Constitution” (A Hypothetical Perspective) — on which deep, thought-provoking, and meaningful discussions took place.

**Bhopal:** The Open Thailand National Championship-2025 was organized from 14 to 18 April 2025 at the National Sailing Club Sat-tahip Thailand. About 239 players from teams of 10 countries participated in this international championship held in Thailand, which included India, Malaysia, Thailand, Hong Kong, China, Myanmar, Russia, New Zealand, Japan and Taipei. Participation was organized in 06 events of sailing in the championship, 1. 470 class, 2. 420 class, 3. LCA 4, 6, 7, 4. 29ER, 5. Optimist, and 6. Hobie-16 event. In the championship, Sports Academy's sailing players Eklavya Batham and Akshat Kumar Dohre won bronze medals by performing well in the International 420 class event. This is the first time that the players of the Sports Academy won medals by giving commendable sports performance in the championship. Sports Minister Shri Vishwas Kailash Sarang congratulated both the medal winning players of the International Championship held in Thailand while appreciating their sports performance.

## NSUI demands action in Nursing Scandal

► Submits documents to Chief Secretary

**Bhopal:** The National Students' Union of India (NSUI) has intensified its campaign regarding the widely publicized nursing scam in Madhya Pradesh. On Friday, the organization presented a detailed memorandum to the Chief Secretary, accusing officials of shielding the culprits involved in the scandal. The memorandum was accompanied by crucial documents related to the case.

At a press conference on Saturday, NSUI State Vice President Ravi Parmar addressed the media, outlining the organization's demands. He emphasized that NSUI is calling for an independent, high-level investigation into the state-wide nursing scam and for stringent action against those found guilty. Parmar made it clear that the organization would not remain silent until the real culprits are punished and their fight will continue until justice is served.

Parmar expressed his deep dissatisfaction that, even a year



after the scam was exposed, no concrete action has been taken against the offenders. He pointed out that while the former Medical Education Commissioner had issued show-cause notices to over 110 doctors and nursing staff, the current commissioner, Tarun Rathi, has only charged 70 individuals. Parmar termed this as an attempt to shield the remaining culprits.

In the memorandum submitted by NSUI, several officials and staff from Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal, and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Medical College, Jabalpur, are explicitly named,

with serious accusations against them. Despite these charges, many of them continue to hold their positions. The organization raised concerns about the impartiality of the ongoing investigation, questioning its fairness.

**NSUI has outlined the following key demands to the Chief Secretary:**

- ◆ Conduct an independent and impartial investigation into the state-wide nursing scam.
  - ◆ Suspend guilty officials and staff with immediate effect.
  - ◆ Conduct a high-level review of the role of Medical Education Commissioner Tarun Rathi.
  - ◆ File criminal cases against those involved, including Pratibha Singh Thakur, and take judicial action.
- Ravi Parmar stressed that NSUI is serious about this matter and will continue its protests until the culprits are brought to justice. He urged the government to take swift action to eradicate the corruption plaguing the state's medical education system.

## Action continues to prevent misuse of domestic gas cylinders

**Bhopal:** As per the instructions of Collector Shri Kaushlendra Vikram Singh, continuous action is being taken against gas agencies, illegal business persons and those doing illegal work of gas refilling to prevent misuse and black marketing of domestic gas cylinders. In the last three months, 1375 gas cylinders and 09 vehicles were seized by registering cases under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 in a total of 32 cases of 09 gas agencies and other establishments under Bhopal district. The total amount of seized cylinders and vehicles is Rs 63,82,038/-. Also, in the cases registered earlier, as per the order passed



in 05 cases under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955, a penalty of Rs. 30,171 has been imposed and de-

posited with the government.

In the course of this action, on April 15, intensive action was taken at places like Gandhi Nagar, TT Nagar, Mata Mandir, Depot Square, 12 offices etc. and in 03 cases, a total of 125 domestic gas cylinders, 01 gas furnace, 01 electronic weighing scale and 01 Tata 407 vehicle were seized, the total estimated value of the seized material is Rs. 5 lakh 77 thousand 960. On finding violation of the provisions of Liquefied Petroleum Gas Supply and Distribution Regulation Order, 2000 against the accused, action is being taken by registering a case under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955.

## Special health camp by CMHO office for NCC cadets



**Bhopal:** Chief Medical and Health Officer Office, Bhopal organized a special screening and awareness camp for NCC cadets at the National Cadet Corps Headquarters. Sickle cell and hemophilia disease were examined in the camp, along with health checkup of the cadets.

81 cadets of Army, Naval and Air Force took advantage of health services in the camp. Abha ID of 61 cadets was made. Commander of National Cadet Corps Bhopal Brigadier Ajit Singh, Colonel Dushyant, Captain Rahul Gupta along with health department officials, doctors and paramedical staff participated in the camp.

On this occasion, Captain Dr. Chandra Bahadur Singh Dangri, Nodal Officer of NCC Directorate Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, gave information about the

symptoms, investigation and prevention of sickle cell. Sickle cell anemia is a genetic disease that is passed from parents to children. It is more prevalent in the tribal population of India, but this disease is also seen in other communities. The main symptoms of this disease are pain in body parts, lack of physical development and anemia.

This disease also affects many organs like lungs, heart, kidneys, eyes, bones and brain. It is widely found in tribal groups, especially those living in malaria-prone areas. Under the centenary year of independence, a target has been set to make the country free from sickle cell disease by 2047. Work is being done in the state under the sickle cell operation guideline. The program is also being monitored through the National Sickle Cell Portal and Dashboard.

Chief Medical and Health Officer Dr. Prabhakar Tiwari said that to prevent the spread of sickle cell, it is very important to have marital relations after matching the genetic card. The spread of the disease can be reduced by timely marking, genetic counseling, tracking of carriers and victims.

## ABVP to counsel students of TIT College

► Bhopal Love Jihad Case: Fear of many girls being made victims

**Bhopal:** The issue of love jihad is gaining momentum as the Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) prepares to counsel all students at TIT College. ABVP workers will visit classrooms to provide guidance following the revelation of serious allegations involving the rape of four students by former students of the college. Reports indicate that many girls may have fallen victim to similar crimes.

So far, cases have been filed across five police stations in the capital, involving six girls who have reportedly been raped. One of the accused, Farhan, has been arrested and is currently under investigation during a three-day remand. Additionally, another suspect, Sahil, has been brought from Panna to Bhopal for questioning. The police are expected to present the accused in court on Monday. It has been noted that the accused allegedly targeted poor Hindu girls.

## Established a dance class

During interrogation, Sahil Khan revealed that he is originally from Panna. After losing interest in his studies after the first year, he opened a dance class in the Ashoka Garden area, where he reportedly admitted only Hindu girls. As a dance teacher, he would establish close relationships with the students. Investigators have uncovered disturbing evidence, including a video from Farhan's mobile phone showing him assaulting three girls simultaneously. Another video revealed a victim from Indore being subjected to torture with a cigarette. The accused are said to have brutally tortured the girls, documenting the abuse by recording videos that were saved on their mobile devices.



## Will not spare the criminal: CM

Chief Minister Dr. Mohan Yadav said that Madhya Pradesh is known for good governance, so there is no place for crime and criminals here. Whoever commits a crime will be punished, our government has not allowed any kind of jihad or love jihad on the soil of the

state. Whoever is found doing this on our land will not be spared, whether he is inside the state or has fled outside the state, our police will catch him from everywhere and bring him. This is our resolve. Chief Minister Dr. Yadav said this in a message issued to the media.

## Students, staff learn disaster management at tribal hostel

**Bhopal:** NDRF organized a one-day workshop on disaster management at the Scheduled Caste and Tribal College Boys Hostel located at Bhadbhada. In the workshop focused on life saving, first aid and management during natural disasters, students and staff were trained by NDRF on various aspects related to disaster. The workshop was organized under the chairmanship of Inspector Satyajit Singh of the 11th Battalion of the National

Disaster Relief Force.

The students of this hostel, run by the Assistant Commissioner Scheduled Caste and Tribal Affairs Department, were given training on snake bite, giving CPR and first aid by the trainers of NDRF. The students were also given practical training about the process of CPR.

Shadow training was also provided through mock drill to deal with situations like flood and earthquake under

natural disaster. During the workshop, counselling officer Mr. Amit Kumar Arajaria gave the message of being alert and aware in case of emergency incidents and disasters. He said that the aim of this workshop is to prepare the students to deal with any disaster situation. At the end of the workshop, hostel superintendent Mr. Sanjay Gautam expressed his gratitude to the NDRF team and the citizens present.

## 45 health institutions certified under NQAS

**Bhopal:** Five more Ayushman Arogya Mandirs of Bhopal have been certified under the National Quality Assurance Standard. In the certification issued by the National Health System Resource Center, Ayushman Arogya Mandir Ratibad qualified with 89.51% and Tumda with 83.46% marks among primary health centers. Ayushman Arogya Mandir

Majidgarh got 82.83%, Ayushman Arogya Mandir Balampur got 87.60%, Ayushman Arogya Mandir Pipaliya Bah Khan got 84.03% marks among sub-health centers. These institutions were evaluated in the month of March. Including these, till now 35 health institutions of Bhopal have been certified in the National Quality Assurance Standard.
