

Mass transfer of outsourced power workers sparks outcry

Bhopal: In an unprecedented move, the Madhya Kshetra Vidyut Vitran Company (MPMKVVL) has transferred around 10,000 outsourced electricity line attendants, sub-station operators, and computer operators across distances ranging from 10 to 80 kilometers. This large-scale reshuffling, approved by the MD's office, has triggered significant concern and backlash.

Manoj Bhargav, Provincial Convenor of the Electricity Outsourced Employees Organization, warned that such mass transfers may increase the risk of electrical accidents. Many workers, unfamiliar with the complex circuits and line crossings at new locations, may face life-threatening challenges. The organization, supported by general secretaries Rahul Malviya and Dinesh Sisodia, has urged intervention from the Chief Minister, Energy Minister, and senior officials to halt the transfers.

Financial stability of low-paid workers impacted

Bhargav highlighted that never in the state's fifty-year history have such extensive transfers occurred in such a short time across any department. This decision has also



severely impacted the financial stability of these low-paid workers, as a significant portion of their wages will now be consumed by daily travel costs. Many fear this could disrupt their ability to support their families. Despite pending arrears for 11 months—despite court and labor commissioner directives—the company has prioritized these transfers, drawing criticism for misplaced priorities.

Divyang and female employees also shifted

Further outrage stems from the

transfer of Divyang employees and over 300 women workers to distant areas. Bhargav cited cases like Raju Mewada, who suffered a spinal injury during duty and was still transferred 16 km away.

Similarly, physically challenged staff and women posted in cities like Bhopal, Raisen, and Gwalior have been sent to remote areas, raising concerns over safety and accessibility.

The move is now being widely condemned as harsh, poorly timed, and insensitive to the welfare of vulnerable outsourced workers.

Officials review flood preparedness and grievance redressal

Bhopal: Under the guidance of District Collector Kaushalendra Vikram Singh, a crucial district-level TL (Time Limit) meeting was held on Monday. The session, chaired by ADMs Ankur Meshram and Prakash Nayak, brought together all Sub-Divisional Magistrates (SDMs) and officials from various departments to strategize for the impending monsoon season.

Proactive measures for flood disaster management

A major focus of the meeting was flood disaster management preparedness ahead of the rains. ADM Meshram directed all SDMs and the Municipal Corporation to

identify flood-prone areas within their jurisdictions and develop comprehensive relief management plans. He emphasized the immediate need to remove encroachments from natural reservoirs, drainage channels, rivers, and streams. Instructions were also given for the inspection of ponds and dams, along with the preparation of a list of dilapidated buildings for necessary action.

This includes maintaining roads, communication networks, and bridges, pre-identifying relief camp locations, forming ward-wise disaster management committees, and establishing robust information dissemination systems. Special emphasis was placed on maintaining regular coordination with the control room.

Massive tree plantation drive underway

Part of 'Jal Ganga Samvardhan Abhiyan' in Bhopal



Bhopal: Divisional Commissioner Sanjeev Singh announced a large-scale tree plantation drive across Bhopal as part of the ongoing 'Jal Ganga Samvardhan Abhiyan' (Water-Ganga Conservation Campaign) in the state. Kicking off on World Environment Day, June 5th, this initiative calls for strong coordination among all departments to plant trees in various gardens, parks, and green spaces throughout the city. Emphasis will be placed on ensuring the quality and maintenance of saplings to maximize survival and growth rates.

Commissioner Singh elaborated on the action plan during a meeting held today at the Commissioner's office. The meeting saw the presence of City Commissioner Harendra Narayan, Joint Commissioner Development Vinod Yadav, and officials from the Forest Department, Municipal Corporation, Capital Project, and Smart City.

Mapping green spaces and combating pollution

To streamline efforts, the Di-

sional Commissioner directed that all gardens and parks within the city be mapped and geo-tagged. This mapping will include crucial details such as the garden's name, area, Municipal Corporation zone and ward, water source for irrigation, and the name and mobile number of the responsible official or employee. Tree plantation efforts will also extend to urban areas outside the Municipal Corporation limits based on a prepared action plan.

The City Commissioner informed that Bhopal has 157 municipal parks, in addition to gardens maintained by Smart City, Capital Project, and the Forest Department. Five key areas, including Kaliasot and Khanugaon, have been selected for extensive tree plantation, with other green spaces also slated for planting.

Commissioner Singh also instructed continuous efforts to remove pollution from the city's various water sources. Municipal Corporation officials confirmed that none of Bhopal's 12 lakes receive polluted water from industries.
