

Traffic chaos outside Hamidia Hospital

- ‘No Parking’ zone turns into a vehicle hub
- Ambulance movement disrupted

Bhopal: Traffic conditions outside Hamidia Hospital, one of Bhopal's largest and busiest government medical institutions, have reached a breaking point. What's supposed to be a 'No Parking' zone right in front of the hospital gate has now turned into a cluttered mess of haphazardly parked vehicles, creating major difficulties for pedestrians and patients alike.

The situation has become so dire that even ambulances are struggling to enter the hospital premises—posing a serious threat to emergency patients who require immediate care.

Adding fuel to the fire is a famous tea stall located along the same stretch of road. It draws massive footfall throughout the day, further crowding the already congested



space and blocking a significant portion of the street.

Every day, thousands of patients and their families, many from distant regions, come to Hamidia Hospital in search of treatment and hope. But the utter lack of traffic discipline outside the facility often shatters that hope. From the main entrance to the surrounding roads,

unauthorized parking by private vehicles and auto-rickshaws has virtually taken over the area.

This is despite clear 'No Parking' signs prominently displayed throughout the vicinity. Drivers, however, continue to ignore the rules, leaving their vehicles wherever they please. As a result, the roads narrow considerably, leading to long

traffic snarls and delays.

The brunt of this chaos is borne by patients in urgent need of medical attention. Ambulances caught in traffic frequently fail to reach the hospital on time, sometimes with life-threatening consequences. Pedestrians, especially elderly people and women, find it extremely difficult and dangerous to cross the road, having to navigate through tight spaces between parked vehicles.

Locals and shopkeepers confirm that the problem has been escalating over time. What started with an occasional illegally parked vehicle has now become a rampant issue. Many drivers even abandon their cars in the middle of the road, bringing traffic to a complete standstill. It's a clear indication that traffic rules are being openly flouted, with little to no enforcement.

If not addressed immediately, this worsening traffic situation outside Hamidia Hospital could lead to serious consequences—not just for commuters but also for patients whose lives depend on timely access to medical services.

West Central Railway launches comprehensive safety initiative

Four weeks, four campaigns

Bhopal: Under directives from the Railway Board, West Central Railway (WCR) has rolled out a four-week campaign focused on enhancing rail safety and infrastructure across its network. Each week targets a specific safety aspect, beginning with the upgradation of passenger loop lines—critical for managing train traffic, overtaking, and crossings on high-density routes.

The campaign launched in Bhopal and Kota divisions with awareness drives around passenger loop improvements. It expanded to Jabalpur division on the second day. This initiative also highlights key areas like USFD inspections, yard safety enhancements, interlocking systems, and gauge alignment. WCR General Manager Shobhana Bandyopadhyay is spearheading the initiative, aligning infrastructure upgrades with passenger safety, operational efficiency, and reduced travel time.

Smoke still coming out from garbage in Adampur Khanti

- Causes health concerns for nearby villages

Bhopal: A fire has been burning in Bhopal's largest Adampur Khanti for the last 24 hours, resulting in widespread smoke affecting surrounding villages. The smoke is visible even from Bhopal, located 10 km away, causing discomfort for local residents. Villagers are experiencing burning sensations in their eyes due to the smoke.

About three lakh tonnes of garbage have caught fire, impacting communities in Padariya, Bilkhiriya, Shanti Nagar, Samardha, Arjun Nagar, Haripura, and the Chhawani areas. Janpad member Santosh Prajapati said residents spent a sleepless night due to the smoke, which continued to permeate the area into the morning. The population around Khanti is about 12,000, and they are suffering from the smoke's effects.

Smoldering resumed

The fire initially broke out on Tuesday at 1 PM and quickly esca-



lated out of control. Although it was managed by nightfall, the smoldering resumed due to the excess garbage. As of Wednesday afternoon, smoke is still billowing from the site.

Bhopal produces about 800 metric tonnes of garbage daily. Experts

say that the waste is not being fully processed, with dry garbage not being sent to the cement plant. This accumulation has led to the production of methane gas, which, combined with rising temperatures, sparked the fire that remains unresolved.

Hearing on Saurabh Sharma's bail in ED court completed

► Saurabh's lawyer argues that all ED's allegations are fabricated; court reserves decision

Bhopal: In the Enforcement Directorate (ED) court, advocate Deepesh Joshi, representing former RTO constable Saurabh Sharma, and advocate Rajneesh Baraiya, representing Saurabh's associate Sharad Jaiswal, filed a bail petition on Monday. This petition was heard in the court of Special Judge Sachin Kumar Ghosh on Wednesday.

ED lawyer Vikram Singh opposed the bail for Saurabh and Sharad, describing their actions as serious. In contrast, Saurabh's lawyer, Deepesh Joshi, said ED's al-

legations are imaginary. He labeled them as false and sought bail. After hearing arguments from both parties, the court has reserved its decision until Thursday.

Bail granted to family members

On April 9, Saurabh's mother, Uma Sharma, wife, Divya Sharma, brother-in-law, Vinay Aswani, and Jabalpur resident brother-in-law, Rohit Tiwari, were granted bail from this court. Bail was approved on a bond of Rs 10 lakh by the court of 18th Additional Sessions and Special Judge Sachin Kumar Ghosh. If

bail is not granted, Saurabh Sharma and his associates, Sharad and Chetan, will be produced via video conferencing on May 5. Saurabh's mother, Uma Sharma, was present in court during the hearing of his bail application.

ED presented challan

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) in Bhopal presented the challan in court on Tuesday, April 8, against former RTO constable Saurabh Sharma and his associates, Sharad Jaiswal and Chetan Singh Gaur. The challan includes allegations regarding 52 kg of gold and Rs 11 crore in cash found in Saurabh's Innova car, which is claimed to belong to him.



Central Group of Hospitals installs cold mineral water

Bhopal: Central Group of Hospitals team, in the view of the scorching heat, took a unique initiative for the patients as well as residents of Mandakini Society, 80 Feet Road, Kolar and nearby region, in which they started a 24x7 cold mineral water facility with Aquaguard R.O plant installation outside the hospital premises for hospital's patient & people of Bhopal under the CSR activities of Central Group, India.

Gas Leak Contained at GAIL Plant in Mandideep

Bhopal: A gas leak occurred at the GAIL plant in Mandideep, near Bhopal, around midnight on Tuesday-Wednesday. Upon receiving reports of the leak, the fire safety team promptly arrived at the scene. After extensive efforts, the leak was successfully contained by about 10 am on Wednesday. During this time, a fire ignited within the plant.

As a precautionary measure, teams from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and State Disaster Response (SDR) were dispatched to the site. Authorities established a one-kilometer exclusion zone around the plant by erecting barricades. Firefighters from Mandideep were also summoned to assist. The surrounding area was evacuated for safety.

Local police, including Satlapur and Mandideep police, as well as a Home Guard team, were deployed to manage the situation. GAIL's safety team from Jaipur has arrived to conduct a safety audit of the fa-



cility.

GAIL's Project Manager, D. Dongre, confirmed that the situation is under control. He said, "The leak has been controlled. There is no possibility of any kind of damage. There is no need to close schools

or evacuate the surrounding area."

Local officials, including Collector Arun Vishwakarma, SDM Chandrashekhar Srivastava, SDPO Sheela Surana, and Naib Tehsildar Nilesh Sarvate, have inspected the plant following the incident.

Special Summer Train between Dhanbad and Lokmanya Tilak Terminus via Itarsi

10 weekly trips

Bhopal: To accommodate increased travel during the summer vacation, Indian Railways has introduced a special weekly train service between Dhanbad and Lokmanya Tilak Terminus (LTT), Mumbai, which will run 10 round trips and halt at Itarsi Junction under the Bhopal Division.

Train 03315 (Dhanbad-LTT Summer Special) will depart every Saturday from April 26 to June 28, 2025, leaving Dhanbad at 8:00 AM and reaching Itarsi at 3:40 AM the next day. After scheduled halts, it will arrive at LTT by 5:30 PM on Sunday.

The return service, Train 03316 (LTT-Dhanbad Special), will leave LTT every Sunday from April 27 to June 29, 2025, at 8:00 PM, reaching Itarsi at 9:00 AM the following day, and concluding at Dhanbad by 8:40 AM on Tuesday.

The train will halt at key stations including Dhanbad Jn., Ranchi Road, Latehar, Renukut, Singrauli, Katni South, Pipariya, Itarsi Jn., Khandwa, Bhusaval, Mammad Kalyan Jn., and LTT, among others.
