New Books to Fuel Competitive Dreams Students preparing for various exams, in-

cluding MP Police, CDS, CLAT, and CAT, can now find hundreds of new books under one roof. The acquisition, funded by a special Rs 3 lakh budget from the Directorate of Public Instruction based on student demand, significantly enhances the library's existing collection of over 1 lakh titles.

The historic building, established in 1908 by Nawab Sultan Jahan Begum, remains a cultural heritage site. Its three reading halls host over 500 students daily. With a nominal annual fee of just Rs 600, members can borrow books, and facilities like a separate room for 35 female students and subsidized private cabins for 167 students (Rs 500 for general, Rs 350 for female students) make it an accessible center of learning.

"I have taken the cabin facility here. Many essential facilities are available here at a very low fee. All the necessary books are also available. The atmosphere here is quite good for studying.'
