Workshop on communication, empathy, and dreams sparks a journey of transformation

Bhopal: Women inmates of Central Jail Bhopal, once confined by despair, are now learning to reshape their lives with purpose and posi-tivity. In a heartwarming one-day workshop held in the women's ward, the prisoners expressed their emotions and aspirations through art and storytelling—leaving many in tears, not of sorrow but of pride.

Organised jointly by the Madhya Pradesh State Women's Commission and the Tinka-Tinka Foundation, the workshop was themed "Reform and Personality Development through TV and Newspapers." Through engaging sessions, participants learned essential communication skills and embraced values of self-reflection, empathy, and hope for a better future.

Stories of Inner Strength

Putlibai, 56, once illiterate, now reads newspapers, watches news, and paints. "Life was tough," she shared emotionally. "But here I've discovered the power within me. In many ways, I feel freer now than



Kalpana, a transgender inmate, shared, "Outside, we face discrimination. Here, I found respect and inspiration. I now dream of becom-

ing a fashion designer."
Sunita Bai, full of remorse, said, 'I made a mistake, and I regret it deeply. But I've learned gardening here. When I go out, I will work hard in the fields and raise my children with dignity.

In a powerful session, the women conveyed their inner world through drawings based on themes like "Dream in Jail," "Celebration in Jail," and "Radio in Jail," bringing

out a flood of raw, honest emotions.

Voices of Hope and Support

Dr. Vartika Nanda, President of the Tinka-Tinka Foundation and the driving force behind the initiative, encouraged the women with storytelling and dialogue, saying, "A woman's true strength lies in her ability to stay strong and keep mov-ing forward—even behind closed

Passenger beaten in train after complaining to minister

Vendors assault passenger in Somnath Express; viral video sparks outrage

Bhopal: A complaint to the Railway Minister about illegal vendors overcharging for food proved costly for a passenger travelling on Indian Railways. In a shocking incident aboard train number 11463 Veraval-Jabalpur Somnath Express, a group of 4–5 illegal vendors reportedly assaulted a passenger after learning that he had complained against them.

According to information, the incident occurred near the Vadodara Railway Division. The passenger had purchased food and a water bottle from a vendor, who allegedly charged more than the MRP. When the passenger questioned the overpricing and also pointed out the poor quality of the food, the vendor got into an argument and walked away. Soon after, a group of vendors wearing blue shirts approached the passenger and started beating him without

warning.
Video shows 4-5 uniformed vendors attacking passenger: The en-

tire assault, captured in a 19-sec ond video, has gone viral on social media. It clearly shows four to five uniformed vendors attacking the passenger while a few co-passengers tried to intervene and defuse the situation. The victim is reportedly a resident of Narsinghpur district, though his identity has not yet been confirmed.

A co-passenger named Divya Gaurav Tripathi recorded the incident and shared it on social media while tagging Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw. In her tweet, she wrote that passengers are now being assaulted by railway-associated goons for simply reporting overcharging. She questioned the safety and accountability of services in Indian Railways, stating that such goon behavior is unac

The video and tweet have since sparked public outrage, with many demanding strict action against the attackers and improved pas-

The Madhya Pradesh Housing Board has proposed this ambitious project unis amoltious project worth approximately ?800 crore. To address residents' concerns and build trust, a five-day information camp was recently organized within the colony. During the camp, board officials answered queries, resolved doubts, and gathered valuable sug-

Each resident will receive a new house

As part of the redevelopment plan, each resident will receive a new house that is 20% larger than their existing one, at no cost. Additionally, the Housing Board will provide rent to the residents during the construction phase, in accordance with the guidelines set by the Collector.

So far, more than 52% of the residents have given their written consent for the project, which received formal approval from the Authorized Committee on April 23, 2025. The tender process for selecting an architect and consultant is currently underway. Officials confirmed that work on the Detailed Project Replanning has already com-

Talent search initiative to empower aspiring players: Sarang

Workshop held for district sports and youth welfare officers and youth coordinators

Bhopal: Sports and Youth Welfare Minister Shri Vishwas Kailash Sarang has emphasised the need for a continuous, year-round talent search initiative to identify and nurture sports talent across the state. He said that efforts should be made daily to discover potential, to identify at least 50 lakh talented youth from the state's nearly 9 crore population. Minister Shri Sarang was addressing a workshop for District Sports and Youth Welfare Officers and Youth Coordinators held at Samanvay Bhawan. The workshop featured detailed discussions on departmental innovations. He urged youth coordinators to ensure that the schemes and initiatives of the Sports and Youth Welfare Department reach the grassroots level effectively.

Sarang announced that there will be another round of interaction with the

other round of interaction with the youth coordinators after three months to review progress. He suggested that in blocks with smaller populations, talent search programs should be conducted by forming clusters of nearby blocks to effectively identify promising players. He also emphasised the importance of coordination between youth coordinators and other departments, particularly school games, to ensure a comprehensive and inclu-

sive approach to talent development.

Coordinators should keep in constant touch with the youth: Sarang directed that youth

coordinators should take an active role in every block, maintaining close contact with youth and engaging them in departmental programs and activities. He stated that the performance of youth coordinators will be reviewed again after three months. Highlighting the need for inclusive talent identification, he recommended conducting talent search programs by forming clusters of blocks, especially in areas with lower populations but strong sporting potential. The workshop also featured in-depth discussions on key initiatives such as the 'Khelo Badho

Abhiyan', 'Parth Yojana', 'Fit India Club', 'One District-One Game', the revamped format of the 'Khelo MP Youth Games', the ongoing talent search program, and innovative practices

Youth participation vital: Sarang urged the youth to turn the de-addiction campaign into a mass movement, emphasizing that sports can play a powerful role in spreading positivity and awareness in society. He stated "Through sports, we are not just creating skilled players, but also shaping responsible citizens and future leaders of the nation."

Pregnant woman dies by suicide Amid dowry harassment allegations

Bhopal: In a tragic incident that has shocked the city, a 28-year-old pregnant woman, Anupriya Singh, ended her life by setting herself on fire late Saturday night. Anupriya, who was eight months pregnant, reportedly faced constant dowry pressure, domestic violence, and mental harassment from her husband and in-laws.

Originally from Jabalpur, Anupriya had a love marriage with Deepak Singh around one-and-a-half years ago. Her father, Ramesh Singh, stated that although the family initially opposed the match, they later agreed and provided all the necessary items

and dowry at the time of marriage. Anupriya spoke to her father: According to the family, Anupriya spoke to her father around 8 PM on Saturday and expressed deep distress over her suffering. Just a few hours later, around 2:30 AM, her husband called to inform them about the incident. By the time the family reached the hospital, Anupriya had succumbed to her injuries.

Ramesh Singh alleged that Deepak was unhappy with the dowry and repeatedly demanded more money to support his business. He also accused Deepak of being an alcoholic who physically abused Anupriya, even during her pregnancy. Despite repeated requests, Anupriya had refused to return to her parental home, hoping

her marriage would improve. Anupriya's body was handed over to the family after a post-mortem on Sunday afternoon. Police have registered a case and initiated a formal investigation. Based on the family's statement, the husband and in-laws are likely to be questioned soon. The incident has raised fresh concerns over the ongoing issue of dowry-related abuse, despite strict laws in place. Authorities have assured a fair and thorough investigation.
