Leaking roofs at government offices covered with plastic sheets

CONTINUOUS heavy rain in Belagavi city has damaged the sub-registrar and marriage registrar offices and the office of the district CEN police station. As a temporary measure, the roofs have been covered with plastic sheets to prevent water leakage and further damage to the century-old building.

The relentless downpour over the past couple of days caused the roof of the government building to cave-in, allowing water to seep inside and disrupt its functioning. Authorities are struggling to control the damage, and the roof has been covered with plastic sheets for the time being.

Water continues to leak from the lower parts of the building, making it difficult for government staff to work, particularly

those in property and marriage registration services, and record-keeping, sources said.

The district station of Cyber Crime, Economics and Narcotics (CEN), which is housed on the other side, is also facing the same problem. This is not the only building which is leaking and in dilapidated condition, the old building where the Belagavi city police commissioner once housed and one that is presently given to the intelligence department of police, is also in a poor condition. The tiled roof has a plastic sheet over it to prevent leakage. The tahsildar's office of Belagavi, operating in the old corporation building in Risaldar Galli, is also in a dilapidated state due to water leakage. The staff were forced to work in these offices, despite the poor infrastructure.

FARMERS CLEAR SILT BLOCKAGE UNDER BELLARY NALLAH BRIDGE, RESTORE WATER FLOW

Belagavi: Farmers from Vadgaon took matters into their own hands by clearing silt and debris under the Bellary Nallah bridge on Dhamane Road which was obstructing the natural flow of water, in Belagavi on Thursday. This timely intervention helped in the smooth drain water flow as the floodwater had inundated agricultural fields in Vadgaon and Yellur areas earlier. Persistent rainfall over the past four days had caused the Bellary Nallah to overflow, submerging nearby farmlands and damaging crops. The accumulation of silt, plastic waste, and leaves under the bridge had severely blocked the drain's flow, further worsening the waterlogging. In the absence of administrative action, local farmers entered the scene. With support from farmer leader Ramakant Konduskar, who provided a JCB machine at his own expense, the farmers removed the waste from beneath the bridge. This effort has successfully restored the flow of the nallah, allowing the stagnant water in the agricultural fields to begin draining. ENS

'Six months on, yet no relief for UKP displaced'

EVEN as Chief Minister Siddaramaiah attempts to pacify unhappy Congress legislators, Excise Minister R. B. Timmapur has voiced dissatisfaction over the government's persistent negligence in implementing works related to the Upper Krishna Project (UKP).

During a visit to Mudhol near Bagalkot, Timmapur met with a delegation of families displaced by the UKP work, who highlighted their ongoing hardships. Expressing concern, the minister described the government's inaction despite the passage of six months since promises were made, as unjust and unacceptable.

Acknowledging the validity of their grievances, Timmapur assured the delegation that he would raise the issue directly with the Chief Minister. He reaffirmed his unwavering support for the displaced and committed to standing by them until their demands are addressed.

It is worth noting that the displaced families had staged an overnight protest in December last year, which they later withdrew based on the government's assurance that their concerns would be resolved within six months. The minister expressed disappointment that no substantial progress had been made since then.

3, INCLUDING MANAGER, HELD FOR STEALING 58 KG OF GOLD

The accused confessed they planned to rob the V'pura bank after watching movies

THREE people have been arrested in connection with the theft of 58 kg of gold jewellery worth Rs 53 crore from a branch of Canara Bank at Managuli in Vijayapura district in May. Around 10.5 kg of melted gold has been recovered from them.

The prime accused has been identified as Vijaykumar Miryal, 41, who was the senior manager of the branch, and the other accused as Chandrashekar Neralla, 38, a realtor and casino owner, and Sunil Moka, 40, Neralla's associate. They have been remanded in judicial custody.

Disclosing this to reporters here on Thursday, superintendent of police Laxman Nimbargi said, "The accused, who stole gold jewellery from the bank, were inspired by some Hollywood and Bollywood films. They planned the theft meticulously after watching sev-

eral films on bank robbery."

Nimbargi said the accused began preparing for the theft in February. As part of their plan, they conducted a reconnaissance of the branch and got duplicate keys of the lockers prepared.

"Miryal handed over the keys to the lockers to other accused to make du-

plicate ones," he said. Meanwhile, Miryal got transferred to another branch of the bank on May 9. The accused waited till Miryal handed over charge to the other officer so that his role in the case would not be suspected.

"Finally, the accused entered the bank on the night of May 24 as it was a holiday on account of Second Saturday. They opened the lockers with the duplicate keys and took away jewellery and other valuables. They went to the bank on motorcycles. But to avoid being detected, they loaded their motorcycles onto a truck along with the loot and left the bank," he said.

Nimbargi said during investigations, the police found lemons, vermilion and other items used to perform black magic from the bank premises. This was done to mislead the investigating officers. The vehicles used by the accused have been seized.

Conman from Kolhapur arrested, gold worth Rs 7L recovered

Belagavi: Police have arrested a conman, Dastgir Gulab Shaikh (38), at Harugeri on Wednesday. He is from Kolhapur. The accused confessed to deceiving and robbing women of gold jewellery by luring them with false promises of bank deposits. Gold ornaments worth Rs 7 lakh were recovered from him. The investigation began after a complaint was lodged on June 1 by a Rukmavva Krishnappa Kamble. In the complaint, Rukmavva stated that Dastgir approached her claiming that Rs 40,000 was deposited at a bank in Alagwadi in her name. He offered to take her there. On the way, Dastgir tricked the woman into removing her necklace by claiming that the bank had CCTV cameras and that staff would not release the money, if they saw her wearing jewellery. He then asked her to hand over the jewellery to him, so that he could snap a picture without it, and told to return it later. Once she handed it to him, he fled. ENS
