

All-around progress under PM Modi's 11-year tenure: CM

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai said on Wednesday that the 11-year tenure of Prime Minister Narendra Modi so far has been historic and there has been development all-around.

He said this while speaking to the media personnel in Raipur.

The standard of living of every citizen of the country has improved. As per the latest report of the World Bank, 26.5 crore people in the country have come out of the poverty line, Sai said.

Under the double engine government, the security forces have neutralised a total of 425 Naxalites, including top leaders like Basavaraju and Sudhakar, he said.

Also, a total of 1,388 Maoists have surrendered and 1,443 have been apprehended, he said.

Sai added that the development of India's first semiconductor plant has commenced in Nava Raipur at a cost of Rs



1,100 crore to make the chips of all devices here. To fulfil Modi's promises, we have approved 26 lakh Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) houses in Chhattisgarh, he said. Out of this, 15.38 lakh houses have been completed, he said.

As many as 26 lakh farmers in the state are benefiting from the Pradhan Mantri

Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme. Of them, a total of 32,500 farmers belong to special backward tribes, he said.

"History will remember many achievements of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, like the construction of the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi temple, Article 370, CAA, and women's reservation," he said.

The government has made such plans that the common people are not benefiting from them, he said.

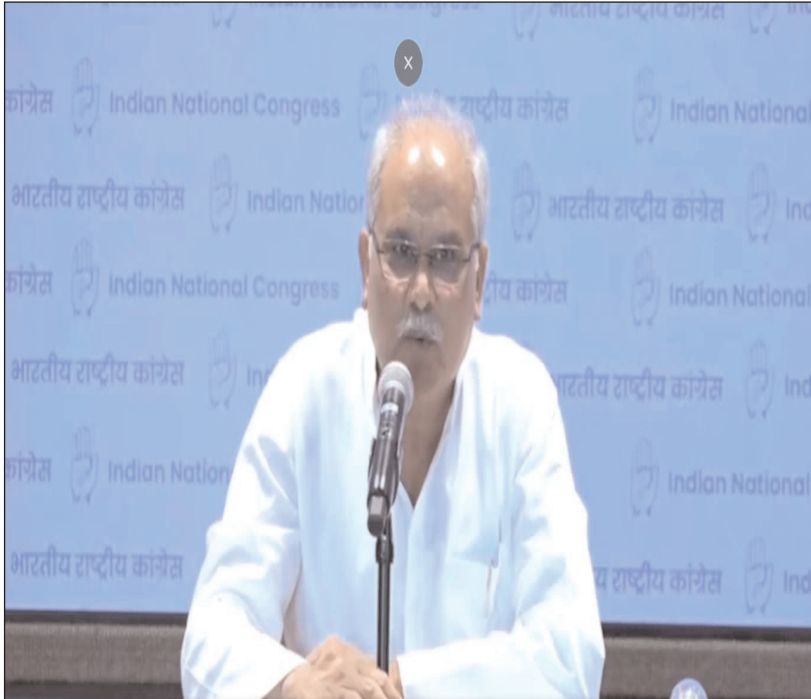
In these 11 years the rich have become richer and the poor poorer, he said.

Four arrested on cheating charges

Chhattisgarh police have arrested four persons from Jharkhand, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh and brought them here for cheating people with promises of huge profits through share trading, police said on Wednesday.

The accused had cheated the complainant, Hemant Kumar Jain of Raipur, out of Rs 2.66 crore on promises of huge profits through trading in the stock market.

The police identified the accused as Ashok Khairati Lal and Priyank Brahmabhatt both from Gujarat, Nagendra Kumar from Jharkhand, and Sheikh Baba from Andhra Pradesh.

Under 'Operation Cyber Shield', technical analysis was conducted, and the main accused were identified.

The accused had changed their residence to evade arrest.

Teams were dispatched to Jharkhand, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh. Simultaneous raids were conducted in



Ahmedabad, Hazaribagh, East Godavari, and Gandhinagar, and they were nabbed. During the raids, documents related to the case, computers, scanners, and other electronics were recovered. A court sent the four to prison.

Study finds why some people with memory problems often overeat

A team of US scientists has discovered a specific group of brain cells that could explain why people with memory problems often overeat.

The team showed that people who also keep forgetting about recent meals can trigger excessive hunger and can lead to disordered eating.

Researchers from the University of Southern California showed that the group of brain cells can create memories of meals, encoding not just what food was eaten but when it was eaten.

During eating, neurons in the ventral hippocampus region of the brain become active and form what the team of researchers call "meal engrams" -- specialised memory traces that store information about the experience of food consumption.

While scientists have long studied engrams for their role in storing memories and other experiences in the brain, the new study, published in the journal Nature Communications, identified engrams dedicated to meal experiences.

"Meal engrams function like sophisticated biological databases that store multiple types of information such as where you were eating, as well as the time that you ate," said Scott Kanoski, Professor of biological sciences at the USC Dornsife College of Letters, Arts and Sciences.

Kanoski added that the findings could eventually inform new clinical approaches for treating obesity and weight management.

Current weight management strategies often focus on restricting food intake or increasing exercise, but the new research suggests that

enhancing meal memory formation could be equally important.

The research team used advanced neuroscience techniques to observe the brain activity of laboratory rats as they ate, providing the first real-time view of how meal memories form.

The meal memory neurons are distinct from brain cells involved in other types of memory formation.

When researchers selectively destroyed these neurons, lab rats showed impaired memory for food locations but retained normal spatial memory for non-food-related tasks, indicating a specialized system dedicated to meal-related information processing.

The study revealed that meal memory neurons communicate with the lateral hypothalamus, a brain region long known to control hunger and eating behaviour. When this hippocampus-hypothalamus connection was blocked, the lab rats overate and could not remember where meals were consumed.
