NEW DELHI, MAY 29

Heavy rains lashed several parts of Delhi and the National Capital Region (NCR) on Thursday, bringing much-needed relief from the relentless heat. The downpour was preceded by strong winds and intense dust storms, which swept through the city, reducing visibility and causing a brief period of chaos on roads.

Several areas across Delhi and the National Capital Region (NCR) were expected to experience rain accompanied by gusty winds reaching speeds of up to 60 km/h, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast said. An orange alert was issued for most parts of Delhi-NCR.

An orange alert was issued for the majority of the National Capital Region, while a yellow alert was sounded for areas in the northwest and southwestern parts of the NCR. The yellow alert covered Panipat, Bhiwani, Jhajjar, Jind, Hisar, Karnal, Nuh, Rewari, Alwar, Narnaul, and



Gurugram, indicating the possibility of light rain and gusty winds in these regions.

Meanwhile, an orange alert was also issued for Meerut, Muzaffarnagar, Bijnaur, Ghaziabad, Noida, Faridabad, Palwal, Hodal, Hathin, Aligarh, Bulandshahr and Mathura. "There is a possibility of

thunderstorms and gusty winds in the northwest region of the country. There is an orange alert in Uttar Pradesh, including a hailstorm... Particularly in Delhi, thunderstorm activity, gusty winds and light rainfall are expected today and light to moderate rainfall is expected tomorrow. The maximum temperature may be between 36-39

degrees Celsius... Heatwave conditions may prevail in some places in western Rajasthan tomorrow and the day after... The southwest monsoon has further advanced, covering Odisha, parts of the eastern Bay of Bengal, and northeastern states," said IMD scientist Akhil Srivastava.

The weather department had earlier asked residents of Delhi-NCR to prepare for a spell of turbulent weather, forecasting gusty winds reaching up to 70 kmph, accompanied by thunderstorms and rainfall through the end of May.

The IMD had earlier issued a yellow alert for Thursday, May 29, and an orange alert for Friday, May 30, indicating varying intensities of adverse weather conditions.

This month has already set a new record for rainfall in Delhi. As of May 28, the city has received 186.4 mm of rain, surpassing the previous high of 165 mm recorded in May 2008. The average rainfall for May is typically around 30.7 mm, making this year's precipitation exceptionally high.

Haryana Power Corporation worker Union holds gate meeting in support of UP power employees

Pradesh has been continuously protesting against this anti-employee decision for the last six months. Sangharsh Samiti Uttar Pradesh had decided to go on indefinite strike from May 29. Yogi Adityanath government in Uttar Pradesh has declared this strike as illegal. On the instructions of the government, UP Power Corporation Chairman Dr. Ashish Goyal enacted the fifth amendment in the UP Power Corporation Limited Personnel (Discipline and Appeal) Regulations 2020 in an undemocratic manner and have the right of direct dismissal without investigation which has caused great anger among the power workers across the state.

Checking of vehicles under Safe School Vehicle Policy

BARNALA: Under the Punjab and Haryana High Court and as per the guidelines of Deputy Commissioner Barnala Mr. T. Benith IAS, S. Kulwinder Singh Randhawa, District Program Officer Barnala, checked school buses under Safe School Vehicle Policy in the district today. In this regard, the District Program Officer said that the school vans of St. Paul International School Handiya, B.M. International School Barnala, Adarsh School Kaleke, Sarvotam Academy were checked and 12 school buses which did not fulfill the conditions of Safe School Vehicle Policy, their challans were issued and 3 school buses were seized. He said that the district level Safe School Vehicle Team is periodically providing information to the principals and school drivers about the instructions of the Safe School Vehicle Policy such as CCTV camera, iron grill on the window, first aid box, female conductor, fire extinguisher, license, etc. District Child Protection Officer Gurjit Kaur said that the school principals are making excuses by saying that the school does not have any van of its own. All the vans are being run by private contractors, but as per the instructions of the Safe School Vehicle Policy, it is the responsibility of the school management to take the children home safely.

Don't panic about Corona- follow the right advice: Dr. Krishnakant

LADWA: Dr Krishna Kant, SMO of Community Health Center Ladwa, said that there was absolutely no need to panic in view of the increasing cases of corona. He said that all preparations have been completed by the Health Department Ladwa to deal with a disease like corona. He said that it was believed that the cases of corona were increasing but for this, all the arrangements such as centralized oxygen supply were available in the patient ward and emergency room in the Community Health Center Ladwa so that in an emergency situation, proper supply of oxygen should not disrupt to the patient. Oxygen concentrator oxygen cylinder, appropriate medicines, masks and sanitizers were available in sufficient quantity in the Government Hospital Ladwa. Isolation ward has also been made for the patient. If you have the symptoms of corona disease such as fever, cough, cold, sore throat and difficulty in breathing, then you can immediately visit the Community Health Center Ladwa. All of you are told that people who have low immunity or are suffering from asthma or sugar or BP disease, then they need to take special care during a corona. If any kind of symptom is found, then do not panic. For this you can immediately contact the hospital. To avoid the disease, use a mask. Maintain distance among themselves, wash hands properly, use sanitizer and especially those patients who have low immunity or have any chronic disease such as blood pressure, diabetes, hypertension should avoid going to crowded areas. If it was very important to go out, then make sure to use mask and sanitizer. On this subject, Dr. Krishnakant Senior Medical Officer Community Health Center Ladwa appealed to the general public that they did not need to worry at all due to a disease like corona.
