Transport Retirees' Welfare Forum to hold triennial convention in Kangra on June 5
SANJEEV MAHAJAN NURPUR: The Triennial Convention of the Himachal Transport Retired Employees Welfare Forum, Kangra district, is scheduled to be held on June 5, 2025, at Akshay Palace, Nagrota Bagwan. Providing details about the event, District Working President Joginder Pathania and Press Secretary Shyam Singh said that the convention is held every three years in accordance with the forum's rules to elect the new district president and reconstitute the executive committee. Retired employees from all four zones of Kangra district—Kangra, Palampur, Dehra, and Nurpur—will participate in the event. Approximately 90 employees from the Nurpur zone are expected to attend. Besides the election of the president and executive members, the convention will also serve as a platform for discussing long-standing issues faced by retired transport employees, which they attribute to persistent neglect by the Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC) and the state government.

CM Dhama attends review meeting on ropeway project developments

Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhama on Tuesday attended a review meeting with Union Road Minister Nitin Gadkari on the ropeway project developments in the state. Earlier in the day, Dhama praised Gadkari and said there was no better teacher than him. Addressing the convocation ceremony of the Graphic Era Deemed University in Dehradun, Dhama stated that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the state had been working towards becoming a leader in education. "If you want to learn the art of project management, then there can be no better teacher than Gadkari ji... His speciality is completing very important projects at a low cost. You have won the hearts



of the people by building a network of roads from small villages to remote hilly areas of the state," Dhama stated. "Under the leadership of PM Narendra Modi, our state government is working to make Uttarakhand a leader in education, like other regions. Machine learning, AI and big data courses are being conducted in colleges. Scientific research is being promoted in the state," Dhama further added. In March, the Union Cabinet approved the construction of a ropeway project from Govindghat to Hemkund Sahib Ji in Uttarakhand. The 12.4-kilometre project will be developed at a total capital cost of Rs 2,730.13 crore. Currently, the journey to the Hemkund Sahib Ji is a challenging 21-km uphill trek from Govindghat, which can be done on foot, with ponies or palanquins. The proposed ropeway is planned to provide convenience to pilgrims visiting the Hemkund Sahib Ji and tourists visiting the

Sunflower procurement starts in Barara Mandi, farmers will get relief on support price

JAIBER RANA THUMBAR BARARA: Government procurement of sunflowers started in the local grain market on Monday. This time farmers will get payment for the produce at the rate of Rs 7280 per quintal on the minimum support price, which is more than last year's Rs 6760 per quintal. This will give a direct benefit of Rs 520 per quintal to the farmers. Last year, the total arrival of sunflowers in Barada Mandi was



about 13,000 quintals. This time the officials hope that this figure can be crossed, as

sunflowers has been sown in more areas than before in the district and the weather has also been favorable for the crop. Administration made arrangements: All necessary arrangements have been made in the Mandi premises to make the procurement process smooth. The Agricultural Marketing Board and the concerned agencies have instructed the farmers to clean the crop and control moisture before bringing it to the Mandi.

Kurukshetra parliamentary constituency will be developed by 2030 under CM Saini: Naveen Jindal

MP Naveen Jindal said that by carrying out development works under the leadership of Chief Minister Naib Singh Saini, with the cooperation of all, Kurukshetra Lok Sabha parliamentary constituency will be considered developed first in the country by the year 2030. Similarly, Haryana state will be included in the developed states by the year 2035. He said that Naveen Avsar Naveen Prayas Kaushal Vikas Kendra has been started from Jindal City Kurukshetra to provide technical courses to the youth. This centre will start in 3 months. Similarly, today in Chandigarh, an MoU will be signed with Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini to modernise Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Bahlolpur ITI on PPP mode. After its success, work will be done to modernize other 17 ITI's as well. MP Naveen Jindal was chairing a meeting organised with workers in Kurukshetra on Tuesday. He discussed the development works done in

one year with the officials. Along with this, distribution of kits to sportspersons, financial assistance to girls for higher education, eye and health checkup camps in villages, agricultural fairs for farmers etc. were shown through a video film. MP Naveen Jindal said that youth should get addicted to sports instead of drugs. Youth will be helped in fulfilling their addiction to sports. For this, gym equipment and sports equipment are being provided to players at village level. Work will be done to promote the games which are played in the Olympics. The most important topic is employment of youth. To make youth self-reliant, the path to progress in the field of skills will be shown. He said that when youth will have their own skills, then they will not have to chase jobs but jobs will come to them by themselves. Apart from this, youth who want to go abroad will be able to get work according to their skills instead of working as labourers. MP Naveen Jindal said that at present many development works are going on in the Lok Sabha constituency. The construction of Bhagwan Parshuram Medical College in Kaithal is in progress. Similarly, the work of the elevated railway line in Kurukshetra has been completed, the work of the platform in Thanesar remains as part of this project.

This list will be distributed to residents by the municipal councillors and sanitation department, enabling locals to know the exact timing of waste collection in their area and whom to contact in case of any delay or issue. Chairman Malik further appealed to all citizens to dispose of waste only in the designated collection vehicles and not in open spaces or on roads. He emphasized that maintaining cleanliness is a shared responsibility and urged everyone to cooperate in keeping homes and the town clean and hygienic.
