A meeting was held on Tuesday under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner Uttam Singh to solve the

problems of destitute animals in the city in the auditorium of the Small Secretariat. In the meeting, the Deputy Commissioner gave necessarv guidelines to the officials of the concerned department to find a permanent solution to this problem.

Deputy Commission er Uttam Singh instruct

ed the officials to select the places where the movement of destitute animals was more. Such places should be surveyed and mapped. He also instructed to survey all

27 registered and four unregistered cowsheds of the district and in such Gaushalas, the vacant space should be assessed and covered in the place so that the ability to



keep the destitute animals can be increased.

The Deputy Commissioner also instructed to identify land in gram panchayats for the construction of new cow

sheds. He also directed to examine the cowsheds run by private, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to ensure whether they were pro-

viding all the necessary facilities to the animals. He should work in coordination to all the concerned departments and a detailed action plan should be prepared to find a permanent solution to the problem of destitute ani-

mals In the meeting, Dr. Rupinder, SDO of Animal Husbandry Department. informed that about 790 animals have been

sent to cowsheds since Octo ber last year by the Animal

Husbandry Department and this work was going on continuously.

urban development, Yamunanagar Mayor Suman Bahmani held a review meeting with all junior engineers of the Municipal Corporation, emphasizing the timely completion of sanctioned projects. The meeting focused on the progress of ongoing and upcoming works across Wards 1 to 22.

During the meeting, Mayor Bahmani took a detailed ward-wise report from each junior engineer regarding the construction of streets, drainage systems, community buildings, park beautification, repair works, and other development initiatives. She directed that all development projects for which work orders have already been issued must be completed within the stipulated time frame She also stressed the importance of regular on-site inspections and maintaining strict quality standards, warning that any compromise on quality will not be tolerated

She inquired about the number of estimates prepared, tenders issued, works allotted, and those currently under construction. The Mayor further instructed that tenders be



allotted promptly for projects with ready estimates and that construction work already allotted must begin without further delay.

For projects in approved colonies, estimates must be prepared swiftly and execution started. In cases where work has not commenced despite allocation, engineers were asked to investigate the reasons and ensure immediate commencement. She also reviewed the status of ongoing repair works across the corporation area. Mayor Bahmani issued specific instructions for early completion of street paving, drainage systems, storm water drains, and pipeline installations in every ward.
