Haryana Agriculture Minister calls upon the farmers on direct sowing paddy

Haryana's Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Shyam Singh Rana, while talking to the media, said that with the aim of saving the depleting ground water level, the Central and State governments have started joint efforts and the government was promoting all those crops which require less amount of water and to increase the inclination of farmers towards such crops. The government was also providing subsidy amount. He said that the source of water was only land, water, river and canal. Due to indiscriminate use of ground water, its level was falling day by day and due to repeated use of only the



upper layer of land, a hard layer was formed at some depth, as a result of which rain water was not able to go into the ground water. He said that to save ground water, the government was emphasizing on direct sowing of paddy, farmers doing direct sowing of paddy were being given special subsidy. He said that direct sowing of paddy saved water and energy, as well as reduced environmental

pollution. He appealed to the farmers to do direct sowing of paddy keeping in mind the falling level of ground water. Agriculture Minister Shyam Singh Rana said that he also belonged to a farmer family and he also has good knowledge about agriculture. He said that farmers prepare paddy saplings by traditional method and plant paddy in the field. In which along with time, water consumption is very high. Apart from this, transplanting paddy also requires a lot of labor, which increases the expenditure on paddy cultivation. He said that they have to increase the fertility of the land by adopting crop residue management along with that they have to conserve water by adopting methods like direct sowing of paddy.
