MEHARJOT SINGH SHAHKOT: Intensifying agitation for the release of long-incarcerated Sikh prisoners (Bandi Singhs), leaders of the Qaumi Insaaf Morcha and prominent Panthic personalities visited the ancestral village of Jathedar Jagtar Singh Hawara and inquired about the well-being of Hawara's mother. During the visit, leaders announced a strategic roadmap for future protests, beginning with a massive gathering at the Hawara village on February 21. The delegation, which included senior activists Pal Singh France, Gurdeep Singh Bathinda, Advocate Jaspal Singh Manjhpur, and SGPC Member Karnail Singh Panjoli, launched a scathing attack on both the Narendra Modi-led Central government and the Bhagwant Mann-led Punjab government. AAP leader Arsh Sachar demands construction of canal-side tourism hub on Faridkot canals

SURINDER DAMDAMI KOTKAPURA: Social worker and senior Aam Aadmi Party leader Arsh Sachar has written a letter to Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, sending a detailed public interest proposal, demanding the development of a "canal-side tourism hub" on the banks of the canals passing through Faridkot city. Arsh Sachar said that Faridkot's canals have remained mere water lines due to government negligence and lack of planning, while they have immense potential to change the image of the city. He said that like other cities in Punjab and many models in the country and abroad, if proper development is done around the canals, Faridkot can get a new identity. According to the proposal given by Arsh Sachar, the canal-side tourism hub could have beautiful walking tracks and cycle tracks along the canals, open gyms, yoga and meditation centers so that the youth can move towards a healthy life away from drugs, food zones for local food, juice junctions and small employment centers, cultural zones to promote local artists, handicrafts and culture, safe entertainment places for children and families, and planned beautification development to make Faridkot attractive to tourists. Arsh Sachar clarified that this project is not for any one section, but for the entire Faridkot. This will provide employment to hundreds of youth, increase the income of small traders and street vendors, create a healthy environment in the city, create a strong social structure against drugs and put Faridkot on the tourism map.
