National Commission for Protection of Child Rights holds conference on child rights

KARNAL: A conference on child rights was organized by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) in collaboration with the district administration at the multi-purpose hall of Karna Lake here on Tuesday. Child Labor Eradication Division head Payal Sharma participated as the chief guest. In the conference, views on topics like POCSO Act, JJ Act, creating a safe environment by empowering teachers, parents and children were discussed. Questions were answered in the open session. In the conference, Division Head of National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Ms Payal Sharma said that according to the Child Labor Amendment Act 2016, children aged 14 to 18 years cannot be made to do risky work. If any parent allowed children of this age to work for money then action can also be taken against him as per the Act. He directed the Education Department officials to ensure that children should not be used in the advertisements of any company. He said that the principal did not have the right to give permission for this. Only the Deputy Commissioner has the authority to give permission for a certain limit in this regard. He asked the officials of the concerned departments to ensure compliance with the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) issued by the Union Ministry in the matter of child labour.

Cooperation Department to establish 150 sugar mills across the country: Dr. Arvind Sharma

SHAHABAD: On Tuesday, the 42nd crushing season of the Shahabad Cooperative Sugar Mill was inaugurated online by Cooperation, Prisons, Elections, Heritage and Tourism Minister Dr. Arvind Sharma, while Cabinet Minister Krishna Bedi and MP Naveen Jindal visited the mill. In his online address, Dr. Arvind Sharma stated that Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah has set a target of establishing 150 new sugar mills across the country. In this regard, work is underway to establish a sugar mill in Narayangarh, Uttar Pradesh. He added that Chief Minister Narender Singh Saini has announced the highest sugarcane rate in the country at Rs. 415 per quintal, and he will soon meet with him to discuss the launch of incentive schemes for sugarcane farmers. The Haryana government is ensuring timely payment of crops to its farmers. The online token system has saved sugarcane farmers 10 to 12 hours of time in bringing sugarcane to the mill. Cabinet Minister Dr. Arvind Sharma stated that thanks to the efforts initiated last year to connect existing sugarcane farmers with the mill, 200,000 quintals more sugarcane will be brought to the Shahabad Sugar Mill for crushing this year.

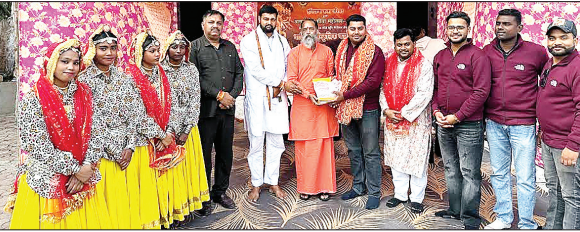


You can still register your child's name on a birth certificate after 15 years

KARNAL: Good news for citizens. Citizens will now be able to register their child's name on a birth certificate even after 15 years. To do this, they must apply offline at the Municipal Corporation office and submit their documents. Mayor Renu Bala Gupta stated that the age limit for registering a child's name on a birth certificate was 15 years, but the Haryana government has now relaxed this limit. Citizens will now be able to register their name even after 15 years, but they must apply offline only. She added that the time limit for registering a child's name on the Saral portal for online registration is still limited to 15 years. Therefore, citizens should apply offline and take advantage of this facility. These documents will be required - He said that to register the name, citizens will have to provide their birth certificate, 10th class DMC, Aadhaar card, and affidavit.

Ethanol factory on service lane causing significant inconvenience to pedestrians

INDRI: Ethanol factory located on Indri-Kurukshetra Road is causing inconvenience to public. Factory management has encroached upon main road's service lane by paving it with concrete. Factory employees' bikes and cars are parked there, while trucks and tractor-trolleys loaded with raw materials are lined up on other side of gate. Due to operation of Bhadaso Sugar Mill, sugarcane trolleys pass through this road 24 hours a day, causing heavy traffic jams and chaos on road. This is causing constant inconvenience to farmers and public. Local residents Balindra and Rajbir said that factory vehicles leave very little space on the road. This is main route connecting Kurukshetra. Due to the high traffic of buses and trucks, there is always a risk of accidents. They complained to company employees several times but nothing was resolved. They demanded that road be cleared of encroachments so that public can travel safely. Sugarcane trolleys constantly congest road. Residents ask management also to take steps to improve situation.
