Rajiv Sharma urges CM Mann to approve Punjab Roadways Depot in Gurdaspur

VERMA GURDASPUR: The Chairman of the Improvement Trust, Gurdaspur, Mr. Rajiv Sharma, has appealed to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab, Bhagwant Singh Mann, to approve the establishment of a Punjab Roadways bus depot in



Gurdaspur city. He stated that, keeping in view the growing traffic concerns in the city, the Improvement Trust had constructed a new bus stand, which is currently functioning efficiently. From this bus stand, bus services are operating not only to major cities of Punjab but also to Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir, and Katra. These routes are extremely busy, and the number of passengers is steadily increasing. Chairman Rajiv Sharma further stated that it has been a long-pending demand of the residents of Gurdaspur to establish a Punjab Roadways depot in the city. The establishment of the depot would enable the operation of additional buses on long-distance routes and ensure better and more convenient services for passengers.


Students of Pratap Public School pay emotional tribute to Pulwama martyrs
